#### **COURSE DESIGN SPECIALIST**

The Graduate Theological Union (GTU) seeks a talented Course Design Specialist. This is a full-time, benefited position which will begin July 1, 2016.

**GRADUATE THEOLOGICAL UNION** is home to North America's largest PhD program in religious studies. The GTU is a haven for interdisciplinary and interreligious scholarship, building bridges within and across religious traditions.

#### PRIMARY POSITION PURPOSE

The Course Design Specialist, reporting to the GTU Dean and Vice President for Academic Affairs, will collaborate with consortial faculty members to design and develop pedagogically sound online and blended courses, programs, and other technology-enhanced instructional materials utilizing strong technical, project management, and coordination skills to ensure goals and timelines are met. He/she will develop and lead faculty and staff professional development activities in areas of instructional design and instructional technology as well as research and evaluate new and emerging technologies and instructional design theories.

## ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Develop and Implement a Program to Assist Consortial Faculty in Designing and Implementing Online and Blended Courses:

- Work closely with faculty through individual and group consultations on course and curriculum design
- Introduce faculty to a range of possibilities for the use of instructional technology in their teaching
- Consult with faculty on the preparation of materials and data for use in the classroom

Develop and Maintain a Support Structure for Distance Learning Curricula in the GTU, Member Schools, and Affiliates:

- Monitor issues in instructional technology and distance learning
- Participate in consortial discussions and planning to keep GTU faculty and administration aware of new developments and changes in the field
- Advise administrations on accreditation issues related to distance learning

Oversee the GTU's Learning Management System (Moodle):

- Supervise the student workers who manage day-to-day operations of Moodle
- Organize and oversee training for new faculty, staff, and students on how to use the learning management system
- Serve as the primary contact for learning management system technical support

#### Teaching:

• Teach one graduate-level course each year that will prepare students to effectively employ technology in theological education and/or ministry

- Travel: ability to drive to offsite events and meetings at other GTU member schools and affiliates
